In the upcoming months, ASF will be preparing to submit the proposal for the program to two funding entities. We also launched our new fundraising campaign, Donate for A Plate in Gainesville Florida where we accept donations for authentic Jamaican meals! This initiative has sold out each time and we are looking forward to being present at larger events.

KEY PROGRAMS UPDATE

ALPHONSO SUMMER LITERACY CAMP PILOT PROGRAM

As an emerging nonprofit organization, ASF is dedicated to partnering with stakeholders to discuss its development of key programs. From its inception, the organization has aimed to resolve one vision- to effectively and efficiently serve as an advocate for rural communities through intentional investments in education and community health. After much deliberation, Alphonso Scholarship Fund, Inc. has decided to restructure its programs to account for more sustainability and longevity in its activities. While the former structure of having three key programs- Scholarships, Outreach, and Camp- provided a wide approach to service delivery, condensing these activities will allow ASF to synergize its current resources.

The below graphic depicts the new and more mission-aligned flow of ASF programs. Under this design, ASF will host Summer Literacy camps as the leading activity of the organization. Merit and need-based scholarships will be facilitated through the summer camps by providing awards to students who have completed the eight-week program. Outreach initiatives will continue as a means of cultivating meaningful relationships with community organizations whose services will benefit the literacy camp program youth, their families, and the community at large.

Scholarships are awarded to students to help cover the costs associated with transitioning from primary school.



The below data depicts the fiscal activities of Alphonso Scholarship Fund, Inc. for the 2022-23 fiscal year.




